PRIMARY FUTURES—CLASS 1 CONSIDER THEIR OPTIONS

A recent BBC article has reported that 'by the age of seven, children are already facing limits on their future aspirations in work'. It is thought that stereotypes about social background, gender and race are contributing factors to this, and children are showing signs of only considering jobs that are 'already familiar to them'. Class 1 children are engaging in a Primary Futures series of activities, the first of which being called 'What's my Line?' Three volunteers from various backgrounds (media, careers and training consultant) allowed the children to ask questions about their area of work and how they came to choose the path they did without actually knowing their line of work. After the Q & A session the children then spent some time considering what the visitors did for jobs and further discussion about careers paths then took place. It was a superb afternoon with very complimentary feedback from our visitors.
