Dear Parents

As I am leading our new Opening Worlds Geography curriculum throughout KS2 (hopefully your children have been sharing their knowledge about the Indus River 😊), I would like to take the children out on a Geography Field Trip to look specifically at 'How rivers change the shape of the land'. Fortunately, we can do this locally at St Nectan's Glen where we can get close up to the course of the river looking at deposition and erosion and also consider the power of water as it carves its way through rock over many years, creating a waterfall.

Details are as follows:

Date: Thursday 19th October

Depart: 9.15 am

Return: 2.30 pm

Kit List: Waterproof coat, school uniform, packed lunch, water bottle, wellies/sturdy footwear. Small waterproof rucksack so hands can be kept free.

We shall be dropped at Trethevey Car Park from where we shall walk up to The Glen through the Temperate Rainforest along side the river, considering its features along its course. On arrival at The Glen, we shall split into groups taking it in turns to visit the waterfall itself. Those in wellies will be able to keep them on if they so wish, but everyone else will take footwear and socks off to wade through the water to see the waterfall, Refreshing! The water must be crossed to exit the waterfall area and so children should be prepared 😊.

When not visiting the waterfall, children will be taking part in the Nature Trail which, on completion, will be rewarded with a gem-stone treasure bag.

The total cost per child to include transportation, waterfall admission and nature trail (including treasure) is £7. Whilst this is a voluntary contribution, we do need to advise that if costs are not met, the trip will be unable to go ahead.
