

English


This term we will be:

- Reading and responding to fictional texts. Grace and family. The diary of a killer cat. Claude in the city. We will be focusing on narrative and selecting appropriate words and relevant detail to sustain the reader's interest. Using some formal story language and expanded noun phrases.
- Choosing words for effect in poetry alliteration.
- Focusing on composing sentences orally before writing and beginning to write sentences with capital letters, full stops, question and exclamation marks.
- Adding suffixes in spelling and using present/past tense consistently throughout writing.



Maths


- Counting and ordering numbers to 20 (Rec), to 100 (Y1) and beyond 100 (Y2).
